

Paying Two Drivers on a Freight Bill

Occasionally, it is necessary to pay an additional driver on a freight bill. This can happen when a load has two legs (pre-loaded by one driver and delivered by another) or when training new drivers requires paying two drivers at the same time. This data entry screen shows a tonnage job with multiple weight tickets. Individual tickets and weights are entered quickly and then automatically totaled. Pebble Flintstone is the primary driver, and Bam Bam Rubble will be paid via an adjustment.
